- 1. Northwestern Mutual will make immediate upgrades and improvements to the parking structure and public spaces on top of the structure. Without a change, O'Donnell Park will be "status quo" for decades to come.
- 2. Parking structure and open spaces will remain open for public use.
- "Selling the O'Donnell Park parking structure to Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Co. for \$14 million has the most financial advantages among three options for Milwaukee County, according to a county work group that was asked to perform a cost-benefit analysis of the proposal." – Milwaukee Journal Sentinel story on Milwaukee County Fiscal Report, Aug. 25, 2014
- 4. Saves taxpayers money: Creates a \$5 million gain for the county, which would be set aside for parks improvements throughout the county.
- 5. Puts O'Donnell on the tax roll: property tax revenue from private ownership will help the county, city of Milwaukee, Milwaukee Public Schools and others.
- 6. Northwestern Mutual will acquire the land with strong park district zoning in place. The community will continue to determine how the land is used.
- 7. Neighbors and tenants support the sale: Betty Brinn Children's Museum, Summerfest, Zilli, the Milwaukee Art Museum and Discovery World.
